- b. Respect differences in society and behave politely, courteously, and with dignity in various situations.
- c. Be aware that Indonesia is one country and maintain a love for the country, unity, and social cohesion.
- d. Monitor and ensure that the government implements people's sovereignty, prioritizing joint decision-making to resolve issues.
- e. Always strive to help those in need, respect the decisions of others, and have the courage to stand up for justice.

The above explanation can help Indonesians apply the roles and values contained in Pancasila in their daily lives so that they can face the challenges of globalization wisely without abandoning Indonesian local values.

D. Conclusion
